In our town the hanging baskets and flower beds have once again made the town more colourful and vibrant. We await the judge's decision to see if we have won a Gold award this year. We do have empty shop units which we hope will soon be filled, but times are changing as are peoples shopping and leisure habits. The town council has just appointed a Town Centre Coordinator to work with us to bring about some regeneration for the town. Support for Ukraine

The town councillors were kept been with assisting in the vital support and aid for this crisis.

Here are some examples of the work they carried out.

Cllr Claudette Harrower collected dressings, sanitary products and baby food etc.

Cllr Ben Holdman says "like most people I was dismayed by the news when it hit and wanted to do something to help".

A local family reached out to me to ask for help. So I was pleased to do all I could to assist. They wanted to raise money to buy an ambulance to drive down to the Ukrainian border where they have family working with an organisation called Doctors without borders in Ukraine.

So along with a few others, we set up a Facebook group and a Go fund me page.

I am pleased to say this resulted in reaching over a £1,000 in one week and ultimately resulted in the purchase of the new ambulance.

Cllr Chris Daw from the Bethel Pentecostal Church said that as a church they sent money out for vital aid. She explained that all of the church network had joined in unison to take up a special offering. The church has contacts in Ukraine and this will help them out there.

A Ukrainian flag was purchased to fly from the town council's Town Hall building and has been in situ ever since.

Grant Applications for 2022/2023

Grants

To receive a grant, an organisation is required to submit their application by completing the Tiverton Town Council Grant Form, giving details of the specific purpose that the grant would be used for. A copy of the most recent audited accounts of the organisation must be provided with the application.

Grants can only be provided to local 'not for profit' organisations.

The Council examines each grant application on its individual merit and makes a decision on the facts provided by the organisation, therefore it is very important that you provide as much information as possible.

It is the responsibility of the organisation to obtain the application form as forms are no longer sent out automatically to organisations who have previously been awarded a grant.
